

South Dakota State Exam for Veterinarians

Step #2, Tasks 1-3: <https://www.aavsb.org/licensure-assistance/jurisprudence-assistance/apply-for-your-jurisdictions-assessment>.

- If you are a veterinarian transferring to South Dakota, you will need to submit an online VAULT transfer request here: <https://www.aavsb.org/licensure-assistance/>.
- The South Dakota Board of Veterinary Medical Examiners sends a list of eligible candidates to the AAVSB, who need to sit for the state exam.
- You will receive an email from @testrac.com with your Logon ID and Password as well as the link to your exam login page.
- Once you have received your email from TesTrac, you have 60 days to login and take the exam. If your assignment expires, please email spa@aavsb.org requesting your exam to be reset.
- After you log in, scroll to the bottom of the page and click "I accept these terms and conditions," after reading through them.
- Click on the exam "Assigned to me".
- You will be provided a voucher code for the \$50 exam, as you have already paid for the exam through the SD Board.
- This is an open book exam and you can access the jurisdiction's statutes, laws and rules on the jurisdiction's website. <http://sdda.sd.gov/veterinary/rules.html>
- There are 81 questions. You have 120 minutes to complete the exam. There is a pass rate of 90%.
- You can pause your test after it's started. However, you MUST complete the exam in 24 hours or the assigned exam is terminated and the score will be reported as is.
- You will be provided a pass or fail at the end of the exam.
- TesTrac will provide your score to the AAVSB every Monday, which will then be sent to the South Dakota Board of Veterinary Medical Examiners.
- Contact the South Dakota Board of Veterinary Medical Examiners for next steps in the licensure process.
- If you need to retake the state exam, you will need to pay the \$50 exam fee by credit card. The AAVSB will send you retake information and you will receive another email from TesTrac with new logon information.
